## XYZ FOUNDATION FUNDING GUIDELINES

The XYZ Foundation was established by \_\_\_\_\_. The primary interest of the Foundation is to provide support to organizations working to- example: **preserve Jewish cultural heritage, with concern for future generations.**

- Funding interests:** In 2017, support will be provided to organizations in the following five areas: (1) **Jewish Culture**, which includes support for museums and libraries; (2) **Jewish Heritage**, which includes support for historical preservation; (3) **Education**, which includes a focus on Hebrew literacy; (4) **Health**, which includes support for hospitals and medical research; and (5) **Special Projects**, as defined by the Board of Trustees.
- Geographic focus:** The primary geographic interest areas of the Foundation are the United States and Israel. From time to time, the Trustees will consider programs outside of these areas, if deemed particularly relevant to the mission of the Foundation.
- Restrictions:** No grants will be made to individuals, private foundations or for loans.
- Eligibility:** Organizations must be classified by the Internal Revenue Service as public charities and tax-exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.
- Grant Information:** The majority of grants range from \$10,000 to \$100,000. In 2007, the Foundation distributed \$5,000,000 to 100 organizations.
- Grant cycle:** The Foundation does not accept unsolicited proposals. Grants are awarded in March and September.
- Type of support:** General Operating and Project support.
